SEPTEMBER BAPTISMS & CHRISMATIONS

The traditional times for baptisms and chrismations in the Orthodox Church are the feasts of Pascha, Pentecost, and Christmas-Theophany. Because of the long stretch of time between Pentecost and Christmas, however, we at St. George Cathedral also receive catechumens into the Church around the feast of the Elevation of the Cross (September 14).





This September we received the largest group to date of any of the festal periods – 8 baptisms and 11 chrismations. There are another 8 or so to follow that could not be received at that time due to various circumstances.







During this 40-day effort (September 24 - November 2), we are invited to join in:



Burial Ministry by Adela Garton

The St. Joseph of Arimathea ministry team is hard at work preparing to serve the members of our parish with matters related to burial and bereavement. We plan to fully launch this ministry at some point in the spring. Currently, the ministry is divided into two main parts: the myrrh-bearers and the mercy-bearers.



The myrrh-bearers will work with families who desire a more family-directed experience with support from parish volunteers when a loved one reposes. More details will be forthcoming, but we need to secure the names of volunteers who are willing to participate in body preparation (we need both men and women), transportation, vigil-keeping, and funeral tasks. We are prepared to help families with various options regarding these matters. The use of the Parish House to care for the family and

the reposed is an important component of this branch of the ministry. Consider reading "A Christian Ending: A Handbook for Burial in the Ancient Christian Tradition" by Deacon Mark and Elizabeth Burna published by Ancient Faith Publishing.

The mercy-bearers will be there to assist and support the family with services at the Cathedral, Meal of Mercy, 40-day, 1-year memorials and such. We are there to help answer questions and offer guidance to whatever degree the family needs. Once the family has met with clergy, a committee member will reach out to help.
