

Potpourri Fr MARK ELEVATED TO CONFESSOR



From August 29-30, Fr. Mark traveled to Houston to meet His Eminence Metropolitan SABA in order for His Eminence to bless Fr. Mark to be a Confessor. Having served as a priest for one year, Fr. Mark became eligible to begin hearing confessions, according to the standards of our Archdiocese. As a part of this blessing, Fr. Mark was awarded the epigonation, a vestment worn around the right knee in the shape of a diamond.



In our Archdiocese, this vestment is the sign that a priest is a Confessor. The blessing took place at St. Paraskevi Greek Orthodox Monastery outside of Houston where Fr. Mark and His Eminence were able to spend time together and tour the monastery with its Abbess, Gerondissa Paraskevi.

Fr. Mark has begun hearing confessions and is available by appointment.



Wichita Teen SOYO *Yes* Trip



A West Side Mission?

The growth in Sunday attendance at St. George Cathedral is readily observable to all of us. It is now common for people to stand for Liturgy in the narthex because no seating is available in the nave. I have heard accounts of parishioners pulling into the parking lot and leaving because they couldn't find a spot. Others admit to simply watching the live stream.

What are possible solutions to this problem? One is to add additional seating and arrange for expanded parking. Another is to found a mission congregation, a second campus, of our St. George Cathedral community. The Parish Council has been studying both options. What is their answer? Both.

The Council has approved a resolution to purchase chairs like those found in the chapel, to be placed in the balcony and on the outer aisles of the nave. By removing the pews from the balcony and replacing them with chairs, it is estimated that we could gain up to 30 seats. Lining the aisles with chairs would add about 50 more for a total of 80. This would certainly alleviate some of the seating pressure we are currently experiencing and provide temporary relief.

However a band-aid fix that allows us to cram more and more people into the Cathedral doesn't constitute a long-term strategic solution for accommodating continued growth. It doesn't account for the fact that both St. George and St. Mary parishes are filled to the brim. For new seekers and inquirers, there is "no room in the Inn." Nor does it address the issue that there is no Orthodox presence on the west side of Wichita, an area that is booming with growth.



For this reason, the Parish Council has been studying the possibility of forming a satellite location of our Cathedral community on the west side. This would establish an Orthodox presence in the area, and potential new members from that side of town could be directed to that campus. Some existing members also may find it desirable to attend Liturgy there on a regular or occasional basis. No one would be asked to "leave St. George Cathedral and join the new church." No, we would remain one community.

This is how it could work. At first, only Sunday Divine Liturgy, or perhaps Orthros and Divine Liturgy, would be served at the second campus. Our priests would alternate presiding at the Cathedral and at the mission. Groups of choir members would also rotate between the Cathedral and the satellite site. In time, more services could be added and a new congregation could assume a life of its own.

By this point, you will have received an email with a brief survey gauging the openness of our membership to this idea. A property has been located that offers great potential for conversion into a church facility. A proposal is being formulated to be presented to a general parish meeting called to decide whether to pursue this option. Of course, it will include a funding proposal, budget, renderings, and projected timeline for completion of the project.



Please stay tuned for more information, and may God guide our community to what best serves the propagation of the Faith and our faithfulness to His gospel!


