NOVEMBER FASTING



On Wednesdays and Fridays prior to November 15, the normal fasting traditions are observed: abstinence from meat, poultry, and dairy products. The Nativity Fast begins Thursday, November 15th. The usual fasting regime is kept everyday during the Fast in November, except we are dispensed from fasting on Thanksgiving Day, and wine and in some traditions, fish, is permitted on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and weekends.

A Time of Transition

Twenty seven years ago in September 1995, we at St. George Cathedral welcomed Bishop Basil back to Wichita as Auxiliary Bishop of Wichita and the Southwest Region. Fr. Basil Essey had been consecrated to the episcopacy on May 31, 1992, and then was promptly sent to take up residence in the Los Angeles Chancery, at the time the only Antiochian Chancery besides the Archdiocese Headquarters in New Jersey.

For five years prior to his consecration, Bishop Basil had served as the priest of St. George Church (and later, Cathedral), and was greatly beloved by his parishioners. Consequently, Dr. George Farha led a group of St. George and St. Mary parishioners to present a bold proposal to the then Metropolitan Philip: if the Metropolitan would agree to bring Bishop Basil back to Wichita, the faithful of Wichita would provide a Chancery to the Archdiocese for his use. The Metropolitan agreed, and Bishop Basil returned in September 1995 and took up residence in the beautiful new Chancery. He was succeeded by Bishop Joseph Al-Zehlaoui in Los Angeles.

On December 15, 2004, Bishop Joseph accompanied Metropolitan Philip and about 50 other clergy for the official enthronement of Bishop Basil as the first bishop of the newly-created Diocese of Wichita and Mid-America – henceforth known as “DOWAMA.” It was a joyous occasion that solemnized the ministry that he had engaged in for the previous nine years: the archpastoral care of nearly 50 congregations scattered over a vast geographical area spanning the distance between Canada and Mexico, from the Great Plains to the Rocky Mountains.

After nearly 30 years of episcopal ministry, preceded by 12 years of priestly service and 11 years as Archdiocesan Youth Director, Bishop Basil submitted his request for retirement to the Holy Synod of Antioch on May 18, 2021. On October 17, 2022 the Holy Synod granted his request effective immediately.



Upon approval by the next Metropolitan of North America, Bishop Basil will likely be permanently attached to St. George Cathedral, where he will be enabled to celebrate divine services. He will not be making pastoral visitations to other parishes, but he may visit certain parishes for special events from time to time with the blessing of the Metropolitan.

As he is no longer Bishop of Wichita and Mid-America, Bishop Basil will not continue to be commemorated in divine services at St. George Cathedral or in other parishes of the Diocese. Yet as he remains a bishop, parishioners will still take his blessing and he will give a blessing at the conclusion of divine services.

Even though he is no longer enthroned on the episcopal seat of St. George Cathedral, Bishop Basil remains enthroned on the hearts of all of us in the parish community. We are also blessed that he is going to be spending the “remaining time of this life” with us in Wichita. We are extremely grateful for his service to us and look forward to receiving his spiritual guidance and enjoying his fellowship for many years to come. Many years, Master!

Nativity Psalter Group

Nativity Lent is almost here and it is time to sign up for the Nativity Lent Psalter Reading group. The deadline for sign-up is Monday, November 14th. Please contact, me, Vasiliki Oldziej via email, vasiliki1@cox.net to sign-up. Please be sure to send your full name and your baptismal name in the email. The reading assignment list will be sent out via email Monday evening, November 14th, so everyone can begin reading Tuesday, November 15th.

Here is an explanation of how the Psalter group works:

In the Orthodox Church, the Book of Psalms, which has 150 Psalms, is divided into 20 sections, each called a "Kathisma" (literally, a "sitting", since the Psalms are read sitting down). A "Psalter Group" is therefore comprised of a minimum of 20 people who commit to reading one Kathisma of the Psalter each day. A Kathisma takes about 10-15 minutes to read. You will find the entire set of Psalms in the Orthodox Study Bible or you can purchase a psalter at 8th Day Books.

This is how it works: You are assigned to start reading at Kathisma 4 on the first day of Nativity Lent, November

15th, then the next day you read Kathisma 5, and so on, until you have read all 20 of the Kathismata twice in the 40-day Lenten period. Please note: We do not come together as a group to do the readings. You can read your Kathisma anywhere and at anytime of the day that is convenient for you. If you miss a day, you simply move on to the next Kathisma.

In this way, as a group, we will have read the entire Psalter every single day in 40 days. Also, at the end of the 40 days of Lent, each member of the group will have individually read through the entire Psalter twice. In our community of St George, the Psalter will be read every day in its entirety as preparation for the Nativity of Christ.

The order of the reading is as follows:

- Begin with the Trisagion Prayers.
- Next, read your Kathisma for the day.
- At the end, say a "Lord have mercy" for each person in your group, and one for the entire parish community.

The reading of the Psalter by our group, becomes a blessing for our entire St George community.

Indonesian Missions Report *Your Prayers at Work!*
