



For women, shorts, sleeveless or low cut dresses and tops, short skirts, tight fitting outfits, and boldly colored clothes are not appropriate. For men, no shorts or message t-shirts; a jacket is customary and long sleeves preferred.

Let us present ourselves with dignity before the Lord in His holy temple!

June FASTING

The normal fasting tradition of abstaining from meat and dairy products on Wednesday and Friday is observed during the first week of June.

There is no fasting during the week following Holy Pentecost, June 7th thru the 14th.

The Apostles' Fast takes place June 16th-28th, with abstinence from meat and dairy products, but allowance for fish Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays.

We at St. George Cathedral were pleased to welcome noted speaker and author Fr. Josiah Trenham, who presented on the topic of the surge of new people coming to the Orthodox Church. He pointed out that the COVID epidemic created a great deal of soul-searching on the part of people due to the threat of illness and death. This caused many to search for eternal verities, leading some to consider deeply rooted spirituality of Ortho-

doxy. He also noted that the increased number of conversions is not due to organized activity on the part of the hierarchy; it has mostly arisen spontaneously from the grace of God at work in people's lives.






Welcome Home



My journey to the Orthodox Church began over thirty years ago when I, as a Baptist, began earning a master's degree in Historical Theology at Saint Louis University, a Catholic school. For the first time in my life, I was confronted with the powerful claims of Tradition. These claims challenged the more selective history I had previously learned in Baptist schools. I still clung to my Baptist views (I was a

pastor, after all) and tried to blend my Baptist heritage with a "catholic" view of the Church for several years. It didn't work. In the meantime, I saw that the Orthodox Church had the legitimate claim to catholicity, antiquity, and, of course, orthodoxy. Circumstances in my life finally made conversion possible, though it has not been without challenges.

I have learned that conversions are not planned; they happen to a person. I did not convert; I was converted. Conversion is a change of heart and mind, whether sudden or over many years, whereby a person finally acknowledges outwardly what has already occurred within. I thank Father's Paul and Mark for their guidance during my catechumenate and the wonderful people at St. George for their welcoming spirit.

Received into the Orthodox Church from Roman Catholicism on Saturday May 9. He then departed for his new home in Texas on May 20. God be with him!




Coming Up:
