

This year's Lazarus Saturday was marked by the visit of His Emi-Metropolitan nence, SABA to our Cathedral and the ordination of our Pastoral Assistant, Mark Sultani, to the holy diaconate. Dn. Mark comes to us from St. Mary's Antiochian Orthodox Church in Livonia, Michigan where he grew up as an altar boy, chanter, and choir member. He graduated from the University of Michigan with a bachelor's degree in computer science in 2018 and—after working for one year as a software developer decided to follow the calling to seminary he felt since the age of 17.

He graduated from St. Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary in May of 2023 and married his wife, Diakonissa Nicole, that same month.

Dn. Mark feels that his ordination is the culmination of a lifetime of preparation for service in the Orthodox Church. Growing up, his parents



filled his home with the music of chanting, the smell of incense, and prayers. The Antiochian Village camp imbued Dn. Mark with a love for the services and music of the Church. His involvement ministries such as Teen SOYO, Youth Equipped to Serve, Crossroad, and OCF helped form his Christian mind and love for spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ. St. Vladimir's Seminary proved to be highly formative for his spiritual life and blessed him with lifelong friends, most of whom are now priests serving in our Archdiocese. He honored to have been

ordained by Metropolitan SABA in our beautiful Cathedral and expresses special thanks to Dn. David for his patient coaching and guidance on diaconal service. Dn. Mark is excited to serve St. George Cathedral as a deacon and feels prepared to greet both the joys and responsibilities of this ordained ministry!





Our 2024 Missions Awareness Dinner



On St. Patrick's Day we celebrated great news from our St. George missionaries who benefit from the generosity of our parish! And we rejoiced at the unprecedented news that two of our missions have become self-sustaining! Floyd and Ancuta Frantz have involved businesses and the government of Romania in the recognition of the needs, and the full support of the St. Dimitrie substance abuse ministry, and the Protection of the Theotokos Day Care Center!

Thanks to your prayers and giving we were able to report that many of the ministries we support achieved long-sought goals this past year!

- Floyd Frantz has worked with Fr. Iulian of Moldova, for a "National Drug Program" there! A dream long sought! Floyd is there right now helping to develop a manual for ministry in this country where everyone has grows their own grape vines!
- Fr. Mike Medis, after filling pulpits for years, has finally realized his dream of a permanent pastorate, at St. Nicholas in Lawrence! He is busy developing fellowships for men and women, an OCF, helping a local kitchen and a Skete in Nebraska, while serving midweek services for catechumens and parishioners!
- Fr. Yohanes in Indonesia achieved his dream of reaching out to his country with the story of the Orthodox faith as he traveled over 2,000 miles to join an interfaith dialogue attended by thousands of people! In a country where he is prohibited from building churches, he has developed schools

with chapels for Liturgical use, internet ministries, and translations of Orthodox books. He has also begun to speak in Protestant churches (after having learned of Orthodoxy in a Protestant Seminary years ago!).

- The tragic loss of Fr. Barnabas in Fiji brought about a connection for us with a division of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of New Zealand ("Orthodox Pacifika"—go to their website to see!) that wants to build a church for their community! New priest Father Alexios is caring for his poor flock by using some of our most recent contribution for food vouchers. Fr. Barnabas' widow Pr. Maria is still helping the community and chanting at each service.
- Finally, Father Juvenal, who stopped here eight years ago on his way to Guatemala, has realized his dream to become a missionary (following his years of teaching at St. Tikhon's U.S. seminary, and assisting the ministry in Guatemala) by pastoring a church in Sao Paulo, Brazil!

As we concluded our reports, we read a post by our friend Bishop Neofitos, currently in Eldoret, Kenya. "Who is a Missionary? Every Christian... must be involved in missions, but not every Christian is a missionary. However, we should all be ready to give an answer for the hope that we have and we should all adorn the gospel with our good works and we should all do our part to make Christ known. Be blessed."

Pysanky Class By vas oldziey



On Saturday, April 13, ten courageous parishioners met in the Fellowship Hall at St. George to try their hands at the ancient art of Ukrainian egg decoration, Pysanky. The class was taught by Ukrainian born artist, Svitlana Tararuk, whose canvases are the fragile shells of goose eggs and chicken eggs.

Svitlana gave us a brief history of the art of the Pysanky, which means "writing". This form of egg decoration dates back to pre-Christian times and were made as a talis-

man for the sun to return and for a good harvest. The decorations on the eggs took on Christian meaning as Christianity spread through the region. Traditionally, the art of the Pysanky was practiced only by adult women in the evenings after all of their work was done. There is a saying that as long as Pysanky is practiced the world will continue.

The designs on the eggs can be geometric or have nature as it's theme. With a kitska, a wooden tool with a copper funnel to hold the beeswax, the melted wax is applied on the egg shell in the chosen design. Then the egg is dipped into the lightest of the chosen colors for the design. Another application of wax goes over the first color and the egg is dipped again in the next color and so on,

until the design is complete. The last step is to melt off the all of the wax and reveal the finished pysanky. It seems like magic to see your completed design.

Everyone who participated enjoyed the challenge. We went home with two kitskas each and our Pysanky eggs. We hope to conduct another Pysanky class in the fall.
