## **BROOKLYN STREET RENAMED FOR ST. RAPHAEL (HAWAWEENY)**

New York, June 8, 2021



The new street sign identifying the stretch of State Street between Hoyt and Bond Streets in Brooklyn as “St. Raphael of Brooklyn Place” was festively unveiled on Sunday.

The stretch of street of home to St. Nicholas Antiochian Orthodox Christian Cathedral, the first community founded by St. Raphael in 1895. Today it serves as the main cathedral for the entire Antiochian Archdiocese.

The day began with the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy celebrated by His Eminence Metropolitan Joseph, who then led the clergy and laity in procession to the corner of State and Bond Streets to the singing of the troparion dedicated to St. Raphael, the Archdiocese reports.

At the corner, Met. Joseph removed the covering over the sign to reveal the new name: “St. Raphael of Brooklyn Place.”

“St. Raphael ministered to Orthodox Christians of all backgrounds and interacted with people of all creeds. He traveled the breadth and width of not only the United States, but Canada and Mexico, gathering his scattered flock. He planted the seeds of this ancient faith on these shores, a faith now embraced by peoples of all races and backgrounds,” Met. Joseph said.

“It is for this very reason St. Raphael belongs to this entire community. Both the faithful of this historic cathedral and those who live and work around it can embrace the life of St. Raphael of Brooklyn. We are honored to share this block, this borough and this city with all of you and this outward example shows that the city and its inhabitants also honor our presence here.”

Met. Joseph was joined by clergy from various jurisdictions and a representatives from the civil authorities.

**JULY FASTING**

July Fasting During this period, the normal fasting traditions are observed: abstain from meat, poultry and dairy products on Wednesdays and Fridays.



**AUGUST FASTING**

August Fasting The Dormition Fast takes place August 1-14. We fast from meat, and dairy products, fish, and wine except on Saturdays and Sundays when there is an allowance for wine, and on the feast of Transfiguration, Monday, August 6th, when there is an allowance for fish and wine. A fast day always occurs on August 29 for the Beheading of John the Baptist in which we abstain from meat and dairy products.



## “HOPPE” in Christ! The work of Nathan and Gabriela Hoppe in Albania

We have missed gathering in the last two years to celebrate St. George’s history of outreach to our community, our nation and the world! **An opportunity to do just that is coming!**

We’d like to remind you of their wonderful ministry, as they come. **Gabriela is a master of creating outreach to youth and women as she devises crafts and Bible studies and camps!** Since Christmas was outlawed in Communist Albania, she has centered many activities for the home around understanding and celebrating the many parts of this precious story.



Just before Christmas in 2019, a devastating earthquake struck close to their city, Tirana. The following week schools were closed, and the Hoppes stepped in to provide a place and activities for children of working parents.

With the strict lock-down in Albania last year, the Central Children’s Office of the Orthodox Church sent out packages to each family with materials that they could use to do activities and engage with each step of the journey from Lazarus Saturday through the Resurrection. They even demonstrated how to create a bier for the epitaphios.

Nathan participates in many national and international agencies working for unity. He has been the designated speaker for The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in Tirana, hosted at St. Paul’s Roman Catholic Cathedral. He participated in a meeting of the Coordinating Committee of the Catholic Orthodox Dialogue and participates in meetings of the Advisory Council for World Vision Albania of which he has been a member for many years.

Nathan traveled to **Egypt in 2019** to participate in a regional consultation bringing together Orthodox and Evangelical Christians from the Middle East and North Africa around the theme of Christian witness in times of persecution and suffering. His Holiness Pope Tawadros led them in focusing on the importance and methods of **building deep relationships between Christians of different traditions.**

After four years of work Nathan completed his Doctor of Ministry degree at St. Vladimir’s seminary! The title of his final project was *Fostering Local Eucharistic Communities in Albania and Beyond*. Having this credential is a major asset in his work as a professor at Logos University!

Another major milestone was having Covid 19 together as a family! They are very grateful to have passed Covid with so little difficulty, relatively speaking, and hope that this has given them at least some long-term immunity.

Daniel had an unexpected opportunity to meet with the president of Albania, Ilir Meta!

The youth group of the Orthodox Church had organized a blood drive. The president came and visited and met with Archbishop Anastasios in the Sunday school room, where Daniel was waiting for his mom. The president invited Daniel to join him for cookies (and put this picture on his FaceBook page)!

From the progress of the children and adolescents who attended liturgy each week in a suburb of Tirana, to the 80 families who comprise the parish now....we thank God for the Hoppe’s vision and outreach!

Fifty young people at The Church of the Transfiguration



in Tirana, have been participating in a special Sunday morning program, when they attend liturgy and then have breakfast and games! Again...we thank God for the vision and the impact of Nathan and Gabriela and their co-workers!

The Hoppes ask us to pray that God would transform the lives of these young people and young families, that they would come to baptism and full participation in the Eucharistic life of the Church. **This is the vision in Nathan’s dissertation and the HOPE that is being offered to the Albanian people by the diligence and faithfulness of the Hoppe family!**
