41st Annual Food For Friends Christmas Food Baskets

A special thanks to all who participated in this year's Food Basket project



Thank you to all who participated in this year's Christmas Food Basket project on December 20th. This year we celebrated our 41st year for this project where volunteers of all ages packed over 13,000 pounds of food and delivered it to 100 families in need in the Wichita area.

From the generosity of our parishioners, we raised over \$17,000.00 to purchase the groceries. Along with the groceries, parishioners delivered gifts that were bought especially for the children of the families. Following the deliveries, volunteers enjoyed a pizza lunch at Bowlero Bowling Alley hosted by the Community Support Ministry.

This is a beautiful tradition of giving that brings children and adults of all ages together to help others in

need. Since 1983, with the help of God and many generous parishioners, we have raised over \$337,000.00, purchased and distributed over 423,000 pounds of food, and provided 3,725 families in Wichita with food for the holidays.

A special thanks goes to Denise Johnston and Joy Farha with Ray Sales who ordered and organized the groceries, and to all the men and women who helped tape the boxes, set up the tables and the food, assigned the deliveries, and organized the gifts. We also want to thank Pratt Industries for their continued support in donating the 400 boxes we packed.

Many lives are touched by this project and we thank everyone for helping to make a difference.

Nativity 2025

My esteemed brothers, the right reverend bishops of the Archdiocese, My beloved sons, the priests and deacons of the Archdiocese, My children in Christ, the dearly loved in the Lord, the sons and daughters of the Archdiocese,

In these blessed days, the Holy Church reminds us of the great event accomplished by God for our salvation: the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Our Church calls this feast “the Feast of the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ in the flesh.” The emphasis is not so much on birth as it is on the Incarnation. The One who is born is Emmanuel, which means “God with us.” By the birth of Christ, “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us” (John 1:14). Let us therefore not be satisfied with the outward expressions of the feast, but enter into its depth and its reflection in our lives and growth, so that we may come to know the “abundant life” which He came to give us.

I greet you on the Feast of the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ in the flesh, and I pray that your days may be blessed and your lives made holy by His abiding presence within you and among you. I place before you some sayings of the French Orthodox theologian Olivier Clément (+2009), hoping they may help you reflect on some of the essential meanings of the Feast of the Nativity, so that you may live it more deeply.

Olivier sees the Nativity as a call to allow the incarnate Word to dwell within us, so that we in turn may become words of consolation and hope. Thus, the feast becomes more than a season or beautiful rituals; it becomes a daily journey of discipleship, through which the world is renewed from within, the logic of domination is replaced by the logic of giving, and the night of humanity is illumined by a light that never fades.

Among his sayings:

- The Nativity is the beginning of the revolution of divine love, in which God enters into human fragility in order to transform it into glory. (*The Song of Tears*)
- God did not come to Bethlehem to assert power, but to reveal a weakness stronger than all power: the power of love. (*The Roots of Christian Mysticism*)
- The Nativity is not an event of the past, but a mystery present at every moment, for God continues to be born in the heart of the one who opens himself to Him. (*The Transfiguration of Death*)
- Christ came so that we might fulfill our humanity in Him, that He might raise it to its full stature in love and freedom. (*The Song of Tears*)
- The Incarnation of Christ proclaims that time is no longer a closed circle, but has become a path to eternity, because God has entered our history. (*The Song of Tears*)

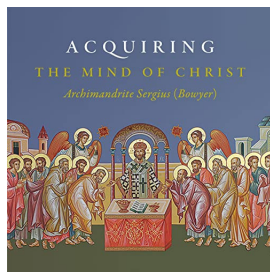

Progress on the West Side Mission Proposal!

As I discussed in last month's article, the Parish Council has been studying the possibility of forming a satellite location of our Cathedral community on the west side of Wichita. This would establish an Orthodox presence in the area, and potential new members from that side of town could be directed to that campus.

A potential location for the west side mission has been identified on 37th Street West, between Tyler and Maize Rd. It consists of two parcels; the first being one acre with a 3600 square foot home, and the second being five acres with an older house and outbuildings.

The home on the first parcel is uniquely adaptable for conversion into a church. This became apparent as I and fellow committee members conducted two walk-throughs of the facility. An architect accompanied us on one of those tours. Subsequently, the Parish Council authorized funding for her to draw up some preliminary plans for how this could be accomplished. Some of her work is illustrated in the images accompanying this article.

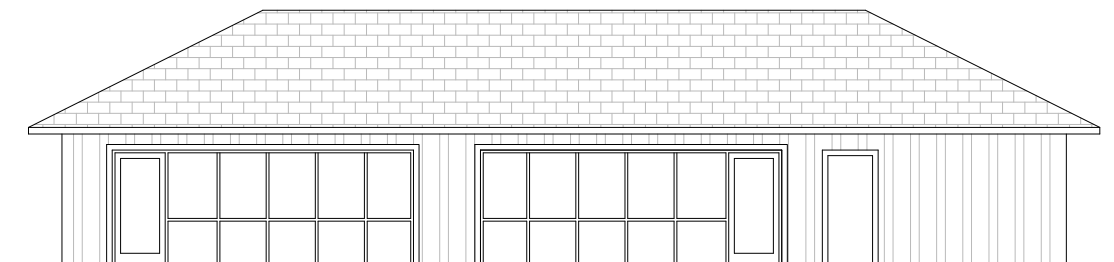
I'll give a brief verbal description of how the facility is laid out, which can be seen in the attached floor plan image. The house is constructed in an L-shape. The master bedroom, kitchen, great room, two smaller adjoining rooms are on a west-east axis. The south-north axis is made up of the master bedroom, three other bedrooms, bathroom and utility room flanked by a five-foot hallway on the east.

In the conversion, the master bedroom becomes the narthex, the kitchen, great room and two adjoining rooms becomes the nave and the altar, and the five-car garage the fellowship hall. The existing garage doors would be replaced by glass doors frequently used in bars, clubs, and restaurants. See the included image. A parking lot is planned in front of the building for 40 cars.

Some may ask, "Why not start smaller in a rented facility without making a such a big initial investment?" That's a good point, but my answer is, "We cannot attract people to something ugly and minimalistic while living in the shadow of St. George Cathedral." Anything we propose must be attractive – indeed beautiful. We have envisioned how to turn this house into an attractive church facility. I believe that "if we build it, they will come."

We have formulated this proposal to be presented to a general parish meeting called for Sunday, January 4 following Divine Liturgy. The purpose of this meeting is to provide pertinent information, answer questions, and to decide whether to make an offer on these properties. It will include a basic funding plan, renderings, and (hopefully) a projected timeline for completion of the project. Please note that we are only requesting authorization to enter negotiations with the seller; an actual purchase must be approved by the parish at a subsequent parish meeting and blessed by the Metropolitan.

May God, through the intercessions of St. Nicholas, guide our deliberations in this matter to the fulfillment of His Holy Will!
